

# 2024 FALL SEMESTER COURSES AND DESCRIPTIONS



## SECOND YEAR – 1<sup>st</sup> Semester

### **Old Testament Survey I – 2 Credit Hours (Monday 6-8PM - James Leeder)**

This class will give each student an overview of the Old Testament. We will walk through each book, learn its significance, key words, key verses, key truths, and understand its broad outline and application for New Testament believers. Special emphasis is placed upon authorship, date, and purpose. Passages of particular doctrinal significance will be examined and discussed. As this is a survey, it is merely introductory in nature.

### **Holy Spirit – 1 Credit Hour (Monday 8-9PM - Pastor Shiflett)**

The fullness of the Holy Spirit is not just for preachers. It is clear in the Scriptures that God wants young and old, men and women, and all Christians to be filled with His Spirit and to live their lives on complete submission to Him. This class, in a very simple way, will present the amazing person of the Holy Spirit to you and how He works in the life of every believer.

### **Bible Doctrine III – 1 Credit Hour (Monday 9-10PM – Pastor Shiflett)**

This class will deal with the in-depth study of the fundamental doctrines of the Bible. This class will be taught every semester of all three years.

### **Homiletics II – 1 Credit Hour (Tuesday 6-7PM – Pastor Shiflett)**

This course deals with proper sermon delivery and the refinement of sermon development. It will include the pattern of the preacher, the preparation of the sermon, the basic parts of the sermon, and the different types of sermons. Emphasis will be placed upon practical application, developing of introductions, conclusions, and illustrations.

### **The Second Man – 1 Credit Hour (Tuesday 7-8PM – Carlo Leto)**

A study of the place, work, responsibilities, and expectations of the assistant pastor in the youth ministry, music ministry, or other ministry of the local church.

### **Preview of Bible Characters – 2 Credit hours (Tuesday 8-10PM – Carlo Leto)**

This course will be a study of some great men and women in the Bible. We will look at why they may have failed or succeeded in their lives. This course will attempt to link the significance of these Bible characters in relation to Jesus Christ, Christian living, doctrine, typology, and prophecy.

### **A Study of The Book of Hebrews – 2 Credit Hours (Thursday 6-8PM – Brian Birner)**

This course will be a study of the background and basic interpretations of Hebrews. Special emphasis will be placed on the superiority of Christ's priesthood to the Old Testament institutions.

### **Youth and Children's Ministry - 1 Credit Hour (Thursday 8-9PM – Caleb Kasprzyk)**

This course introduces the basic philosophy, principles, and objectives in developing a Bible-based local church youth and children's ministry. This course will review various options for ministering to youth and children, including camps, Sunday school, VBS, and reaching the youth through evangelism and discipleship.

**Bible Customs and Manners – 1 Credit Hours (Thursday 9-10PM Caleb Kasprzyk)**

There are hundreds of customs of the Old and New Testaments, In this course the student will gain insight into correctly interpreting the Scriptures in their Old and New Testament settings.

**TOTAL CREDITS – 12 Credit Hours**

**Christian Home – 1 Credit Hour - Ladies Only (Thursday 6-7PM – Mrs. Grace Shiflett)**

This will be a helpful study through the Scriptures discovering wonderful principles on how to create the right Christian environment in the home.

**Christian Ministry – 1 Credit Hour - Ladies Only (Thursday 7-8PM – Mrs. Marsha Leto)**

You will take a walk through the book of Philippians and be encouraged by learning how to experience, no matter your circumstances, a life of joy from the Lord.
