

2025 FALL SEMESTER COURSES AND DESCRIPTIONS



THIRD YEAR – 1ST Semester

People Skills - 1 Credit Hour (Pastor Shiflett on Monday 6:00 – 7:00 PM)

Life and ministry is made up of primarily two relationships that matters: first, our relationship with God and second our relationship with people. This course will teach you how to work with different types of church members. It will also help sharpen your ability to reach people with the gospel and help them to grow in their Christian life.

Bible Doctrine V – 1 Credit Hour (Pastor Shiflett on Monday 7:00 – 8:00 PM)

This class will deal with the in-depth study of the fundamental doctrines of the Bible. This class will be taught every semester for all three years.

Romans – 2 Credit Hour (James Leeder on Monday 8:00 – 10:00 PM)

Romans is a book which is filled with some of the most important doctrines in all the Bible. In this Epistle we will learn about the doctrine of salvation, sanctification, and service. We will marvel at God's redemptive work as we study this book as well as its applications of the doctrines to the Christian life.

Church Finances – 1 Credit Hour (Tuesday 6:00 – 7:00 PM)

This course will be a help to everyone who wants to be a better steward of their finances and see greater blessings. The aspect of managing finances on both the personal as well as the church level will determine the level of your integrity.

Pastoral Epistles II – 1 Credit Hour (Carlo Leto on Tuesday 7:00 – 8:00 PM)

This class will continue an in-depth study of I Timothy, II Timothy and Titus. Special attention will be given to the qualifications and responsibilities of pastors, deacons, and other leaders in the local church.

I&II Corinthians – 2 Credit Hour (Carlo Leto on Tuesday 8:00 – 10:00 PM)

An overview will be study in both I&II Corinthians which shows the way to handle church problems to God's glory. We will also see the heart of God through the Apostle Paul in the way he dealt with them.

Prison Epistles II – 1 Credit Hours (Brian Birner on Thursday 6:00 – 7:00 PM)

This course will continue the expository study of Paul's epistles from his first imprisonment, including Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, and Philemon. This course will cover the historical context, structural organization, doctrinal truths, and practical applications of each of these epistles.

Biblical Revival – 1 Credit Hour (Brian Birner on Thursday 7:00 – 8:00 PM)

This lesson is an analysis of Revivals in the Bible and in Church history. It also contains the ingredients of those revivals and how we can have personal and church revival today.

Proverbs- 2 Credit Hours (Caleb Kasprzyk on Thursday 8:00 – 10:00 PM)

The book of Proverbs underscores the centrality of godly wisdom in human flourishing, encouraging readers to cultivate a life characterized by moral, integrity, spiritual insight, and practical wisdom for living each and every day. As we will dive into the pages, we will be reminded of the enduring relevance of these timeless truths and the transformative power the God's Word.

TOTAL CREDITS – 12 Credit Hours

Christian Home – 1 Credit Hour

This course is designed to help the Christian wife and mother to be able to help her husband and children joyfully and effectively. Many Christian families today are troubled. Alienation often exists between husband and wife, between parents and children or among siblings. What is God's plan for successful Christian families. This class will provide ideas, examples, and plenty of inspiration to help you.

Christian Ministry – 1 Credit Hour

This course will help you to learn some Biblical principles of mentoring other young and older ladies in our church by being filled with the fruit of the Holy Spirit as taught in Galatians 5. There are ladies who need a friend, but more than a friend. They need someone who can pull them alongside themselves and give and speak into their life as much as possible. New Christians ladies and old alike should never feel a sense of loneliness among God's people in God's house.
